News from FEBA in Nepal

They have started regular broadcasting for 2 hours a day using "Studio in a Suitcase". Bob says the team are inexperienced and nervous, but very excited, with lots of nerves and lots to do! They have met the condition of their FM license that required them to be on air by July.

They have several possibilities to extend the broadcasting, taking the portable studio to nearby locations. Please pray for the team and for the listeners.

In India, FEBA is using the same technology to establish a disaster response radio service in South East Asia. They will trialling the approach in Nagapattinam, an area devastated by the 2004 Tsunami with a program supported by other NGOs and will include tents, field kitchens, and generator power. The team will conduct local interviews and then broadcast these using FM and short wave.

Please Pray:

- Two of the facilitators still didn't have Visas, and one had been turned down several times.
 - For the government to release a temporary broadcast license; this is currently difficult to obtain
 - The Health and safety – this is the hottest time of the year and in 38C heat – the trial will be very demanding.
