Minister's Message

As I write this, the season of advent is almost upon us, and when some of you are reading this, the waiting for Christmas will be nearly over - or even passed! Therefore, preparation gives way to celebration, anticipation to fulfillment. But for what? A winter festival to cheer you up? An opportunity to throw good taste to the wind and decorate the house in the most gaudy display of light and tinsel? To help Gordon Brown by spending all you have, or perhaps haven't got? Certainly the high street and the web are hoping that this Christmas season will bring them good news and joy in this troubled financial climate. And perhaps there is much in your own lives that casts an unwelcome shadow to which the lights are a relief.

Undoubtedly in the wider world there is much to be alarmed and fearful about; Worldwide financial collapse and uncertainty, with banks, markets and currencies tumbling, suicide bombers, conflicts in Afghanistan, Iraq, and the DRC. Or growing social and economic inequality and dysfunction, epidemic illiteracy, widespread drugs and crime, giving people reasonable cause for at least some of their fears. Yet this winter, even with talk of recession or possibly an economic depression looming on the horizon, we can all take courage from the message of Christmas, for one of the principle things God wants to say to us all with the birth of Christ is "don't be afraid."

The birth narratives of Jesus contain elements that can be very difficult to comprehend and so we are tempted to disbelieve them, but they also contain telltale signs that in my mind make them radically authentic. In particular, the Gospel narratives record that the constellation of events surrounding the birth of Christ evoked a certain emotion in people: fear. And to each one of these understandable human fears, God responded with a firm and gentle assurance, "don't be afraid." This comfort in the midst of fear is at the heart of the Christmas story. "don't be afraid."

Joseph, upon learning that his fiancée was pregnant resolved to separate quietly for fear of their reputation, but God, through an Angel, told him not to fear, but to be at peace. Similarly, Luke writes that Zechariah (Mary's uncle) was "gripped with fear," Mary was "greatly troubled," (a bit of an understatement!) and the rugged shepherds were "terrified." But to each, God's response was the same, "don't be afraid."

Christmas is the declaration that Jesus is Immanuel, God with us; He has not abandoned us or given up on us. Christmas is no fairy tale story, where "everything is now alright" but rather a message that we are not alone. Jesus himself grew up and left the manger, to spend a lifetime showing the world that we need not fear. Yet from the beginning the fear of the world constantly tried to overwhelm Him. From Herod the Great seeking to destroy him and in his fear killing the innocent, to the fear of the religious leaders and the politicians trying to irradiate Christ's teaching and example, by ultimately killing His body; yet through this even the fear of death itself is destroyed in the glory of His resurrection.

Christmas is part of the great story in which the peace of God is demonstrated to be far more powerful than fear, for whenever fear raises its head, God's offer of peace is always available, turning quaking disciples into missionaries of purpose and churches suffering the worst persecution into beacons of love. Whatever you are facing this Christmas, let God's message of promise and peace flood your life so that you can face anything, knowing that Immanuel is here, with you today and with you always; do not be afraid, God wants to be with you and to lead you into His peace. Or as John said, "God came to us and pitched his tent in our garden." Therefore, let the peace Christ offers dwell in you heart, for ultimately the full peace of God is yours.

Have a peaceful Christmas and expectant New Year, knowing Immanuel is here.

News in Brief from the Baptist Times

BMS DR Congo grant

BMS World Mission has agreed an emergency grant of £16,000 to help those displaced by the recent conflict in Democratic Republic of Congo.

The latest violence between rebel and government forces began in late October in the province of North Kivu, around the city of Goma.

It has displaced around 250,000.

The grant will be channelled through Baptist World Aid (the relief arm of Baptist World Alliance), which is working closely with three Baptist groups in that part of the country

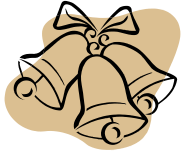

So it happened that he took this orphaned little child with him to give her a loving mother, a refuge and a peaceful home.

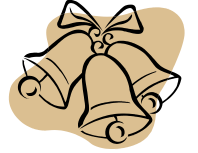


Bridge Over Troubled Waters

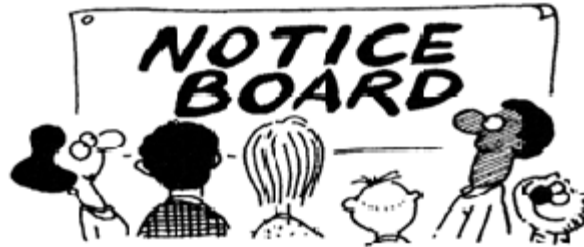
At the Evening Service tonight, the sermon topic will be "What is Hell?"
